

### MESSAGE FROM THE TRAFFIC DIRECTOR

The traffic controls for the 2004 are similar to those of 2003. However it is important to note that roads are not closed. Marshals will encourage the orderly flow of traffic. Please follow their directions to ensure the smooth flow of vehicles. Emergency vehicles have right of way at all times

Due to the risk of accidents on Jayes Bridge when there is a large number of spectators, we ask that you do not attempt to drive across the Bridge. After 1.30pm, there will be heavy east bound traffic across the bridge.

To avoid being inconvenienced by this, vehicles wishing to go from Jayes Bridge to the horse cycle changeover should park in the east side parking area. If parking in the west side parking area, leave before 12:30pm by way of Flax Road to avoid heavy on-coming traffic on Winnijup Road. If departure from the west side parking area is left later than this, it may be necessary to wait until 1:30pm when Jayes Bridge becomes available to east bound traffic.

Vehicles wishing specifically to go to the west side parking area (horse float area) at Jayes Bridge from the start at Boyup Brook Oval should go by way of Bridgetown-Boyup Brook, Brown Seymour Road and Jayes Road.

Vehicles wishing specifically to go to the west side parking area (horse float area) from the running-canoeing changeover should proceed south on Terry Road and cross the river by way of Terry Road crossing.

The east side parking area at Jayes Bridge will be the parking area from which all other points of interest can be universally reached. For those wishing to avert the heavier congested roads, please refer to advice in this programme given under Alternative Travel Routes.

### MESSAGE FROM THE TRAFFIC DIRECTOR (Continued)

The traffic directions specifically are:-

#### PRE LUNCH

South bound parking and travel only for vehicles on Hack and Beatty Streets (adjacent Boyup Brook Sports Ground) from 6.30am till 9.30am.

West bound traffic only on Stanton Road from 8.30am till 10.00am.

South bound traffic only on Terry Road from junction with Stanton Road to junction with Jayes Road from 8.30am till 12.00 noon.

South bound traffic only on Terry Road-Jayes Road bypass track from 8.30am till 12.00 noon.

Jayes Bridge between the two parking area inlets will be closed to vehicular traffic when there are large numbers of spectators on the Bridge (except emergency and official vehicles).

#### AFTER LUNCH

Jayes Bridge between the two parking area inlets will be impossible to cross when there are large numbers of spectators on the bridge (except emergency and official vehicles) until 1.30pm. This will ease but be dominated by east bound traffic till 3.00pm.

North bound traffic only on Terry Road — Jayes Road bypass track from 12.00 noon till 3.00pm.

West bound traffic only on Terry Road from junction with Terry Road — Jayes Road bypass track to junction with Jayes Road from 12.00 noon till 3.00pm. The intention is to have traffic move anti-clockwise out of the east side parking area to proceed via Jayes Road to the finish at the Bridgetown Sports Ground. Vehicles wishing to go to the cycle start should continue east along Jayes Road and follow signs to the cycle start.

### MESSAGE FROM THE TRAFFIC DIRECTOR (Continued)

West bound traffic will dominate Winnijup Road from junction with Scott-Meares Road to junction with Hester Siding Road (also Petterson Road) through to Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road from 1.15pm till 4.30pm (main section of cycle leg). Horse floats from the horse float parking area at Jayes Bridge not being able to get away by Jayes-Flax-Winnijup Road to the horse cycle changeover before 12.30pm, should wait till after 1.30pm (when Jayes Bridge becomes available to east bound traffic), then travel east across Jayes Bridge and follow signs to the cycle start, to avoid heavy oncoming traffic on Winnijup Road.

Horse carrying vehicles travelling west along Winnijup Road after picking up horses at the horse-cycle changeover will be diverted into Bridgetown via Elwin Road, which is adequately sign posted, to be directed to the finish at the Sports Ground or to their camping area it the Bridgetown Show Ground.

South bound traffic only on Krsul Road from junction with Hester Siding Road to junction with Bridgetown—Boyup Brook Road from I.15pm till 4.30pm. From this point traffic will be directed to a northern entrance to the finish at the Bridgetown Sports Ground. When leaving the Bridgetown Sports ground parking area, turn right at the back of the pavilion to proceed to the Boyup Brook Bridgetown road. Turn right into this road to travel to Bridgetown.

There will be parking marshals at the running-canoe changeover, the two parking areas at Jayes Bridge parking area at the cycle start, and the finish, all equipped with red jackets. There will be traffic marshals to protect the competitors and control traffic in congested areas, all equipped with red jackets and flags. The area will be sign posted to help competitors and spectators locate their destinations.

Please be patient and treat other road users with courteously. Enjoy the day.

### **SWIM START**

To reduce possible extended delays to the finish of the event the starting times of swimmers may be altered. The starting order of the swimmers is generally preserved but the interval between each team may be reduced or extended. This has the result that the finishing order is not necessarily the final placing order. The timing system records start and finish times of all competitors to calculate the final positions. Ensure that you are at the start early for your corrected start time. Please co-operate with all marshals during the start to ensure that start times are recorded accurately.

### **Alternative Travel Routes**

- 1. Take Boyup-Kojonup Road turn right Aegers Bridge Road turn right Jayes Road, proceed to Jayes Bridge.
- 2. Take Boyup-Bridgetown Road turn left Brown Seymour Road turn left Jayes Road and proceed to Jayes Bridge.

### Jayes Bridge to Cycle Start:

- From Kojonup side of Jayes Bridge take Jayes Road towards Kojonup turn right at Muir Road turn right at Winnijup Road and proceed to cycle start.
- From Bridgetown side of Jayes Bridge take Jayes Road towards Bridgetown turn left at Flax Road turn left at Winnijup Road and proceed to cycle start. \*Please note:- The Winnijup Road will be a one way road towards Bridgetown between 1.15pm and 4.30pm.

### Jayes Bridge to Bridgetown:

 Take Jayes Road to Bridgetown, turn left into Flax Road, turn right into Falnash Road - cross Winnijup Road into Elwin Road to Bridgetown and then to the Sports Ground.

### Cycle Start to Bridgetown:

Turn east in Winnijup Road and cross Winnijup Bridge — turn right into Hamilton Road/Wheatley/Waters Road — continue to Bridgetown and then to the Sports Ground. NOTE: This road is winding and mostly bitumen. It is longer than the direct route, but a very nice drive and by using it, traffic congestion can be avoided.

### BLACKWOOD MARATHON CELEBRATES 25 YEARS WITH A BOOK

The 2003 race saw the release of 25 Years of Blackwood Marathon History in a book of anecdotes and history written by long time competitor Clive Choate. The book, The Best of Blackwood recorded the history of winners and also some light hearted incidents, some of which are mentioned below.

#### FIRST BLACKWOOD MARATHON RELAY WON BY HALF A WHEEL!!!

The finish to the first ever Blackwood Marathon Relay in 1979 was an amazing sight! North Cottesloe Surf Club's cyclist Graham McNab and Bunbury Old Sports Evan Strudwick hit the top of the hill at the edge of the Bridgetown Showground together, just 400m from the finish line.

It was do or die, and Strudwick threw caution to the wind. He rode flat out down the slope. The Bunbury Old Sports cyclist went up a gear, while the North Cottesloe rider went down a gear. Just metres before the line McNab ran out of legs with such a high cadence, while Strudwick who had timed his run to perfection, was able to throw himself at the line to win by just half a wheel.

#### **KEITH YARDLEY - THE ONLY 25 YEAR COMPETITOR**

During his years competing in the Blackwood, Keith has always been instrumental in helping others. Pre race organising has always been a part of the event, and during the contest Keith throws himself into the day.

I really don t see too much of the race. After my run I help the canoeist when he finishes, then I go around to the horse finish to hold the team cyclists bike. By the time I finish at that changeover, I get to the finish line, just in time to see our team cross the line.

Keith Yardley has been a wonderful athlete in this event over the 25 years, both through his performances in the run leg and his contribution to the spirit of the day in working together with his team.

#### SPRINGHILLS ESTATE ROCKS TO SOME GREAT WINS WITH THE BABY BEEF BOYS

The Springhills Estate in Boyup Brook celebrated many fine victories and hosted numerous World Class athletes over the first decade of the Marathon. Ian and Sue Wallace established the Baby Beef Boys team, which had outstanding results ever since the first event in 1979.

#### STEPHEN BROWN GOES DANCING WITH WILD HORSES

Steven Brown was a talented athlete and dominated the Ironman section between 1990 - 1995. A State canoeist with the Peel Club, a strong cyclist who had ridden a bike across the Nullarbor from Melbourne, and a solid runner, he had learnt how to ride horses to take on the Blackwood Ironman challenge.

The scene which followed, was termed Dancing with Wild Horses by his mates. As Ironman friends Clive Choate, Matthew Ritikis, Nicholas Agnew, Jeff Willoughby and Justin Hardy galloped past, all they could see was Steve trying to hold on as his wild horse circled around him, refusing to be pacified.

### THE BLISTERED HANDS JUST MISSED THE REINS BY THE LENGTH OF HIS FINGERNAIL AND COST THE TEAM 3 KILOMETRES

Bill Dunn was a real adventurer. As the Blackwood Marathon conducted its first race in 1979, Bill with five men attempted to navigate the Fitzroy River in the North West. Between dragging boats between pools and escaping capsizes in big rapids, their survival skills were tested when they lost most of their provisions and a rifle, which was used to hunt food. Civilisation was days away.

Concerned police put up search planes when sudden floods hit the area. The adventurers were sighted, but it was days before they paddled out. The publican at the Fitzroy Crossing Hotel, Jonothan Sandford, shouted a thousand cans to celebrate their achievement and safe arrival.

Twelve years later, Bill and Jonothan would share a few more beers as they joined other members of team 69, to take on the challenge of the Blackwood Marathon.

### PIGS IN MUD !! POLICE RIDER AND HORSE GO COMPLETELY UNDER !!

There was a story going around for many years about the Police rider who fell off in the pig pens near the finish of the equestrian leg. Well, it actually did happen, and to confirm the story is the account from the Police cyclist Stuart Estcourt, who had to carry a rather smelly bib all the way into the finish line.

Later in the afternoon when the other team members came over to the Trotting track for the results, I found out that the manure that was involved was PIG SHIT! That explained everything. Apparently the rein had snapped as he was riding past the pig pens and the horse veered suddenly across a swill pond. I found out months later, direct from Yuillesy, that the horse had taken a few strides across the top until it broke the crust and dumped him in the deep end and he and the horse went completely under.

I thought I was in a bad way, still carrying the smell under my fingernails for a couple of days. Yuillesy had to work alone for three weeks before anyone back at the Police Mounted Section would let him near them!

#### TOPLESS RIDER AT THE FINISH

There have been a number of spectacular finishes at the end of the equestrian leg. Riders have crashed through the fence when tired horses haven't been able to stop. Some riders have fallen off, others have been thrown off, but one of the more revealing finishes came when a rider became entangled in her race bib!

As she galloped up to the changeover point at the fence, she began to take off the blue numbered race bib to pass it to her cyclist. At that crucial moment in full gallop as she pulled the number over her head, the rest of her apparel came with it too!

It got worse. Her number, riding shirt, long sleeves all became entangled over her head, and she couldn't see where she was going. Fortunately the horse stopped its race at the fence line, but there she was facing all the waiting cyclists and horse handlers, with very little clothing on top, and her number and shirt entangled.

#### The Old Gaol: Hampton Street

Dating from 1880 and in use until 1970, the old gaol is one of Bridgetowns most historic buildings. Next door to the old gaol are the original police quarters. Members of the local historical society are happy to show you through and arrangements can be made by contacting the tourist centre.

#### Bridgedale South West Highway, at the Bridge

Dating from the late 1800's Bridgedale is a National Trust property and is the oldest in Bridgetown. A wonderful collection of memorabilia is on show as well as an insight into life in early Bridgetown. Bridgedale is manned by a volunteer staff and is open on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, from 10am to 2pm. A small fee applies.

#### Hampton Street, Bridgetown

A stroll along the main street in Bridgetown is an excellent way to get the feel of this community. You can browse in craft shops, visit the old gaol, have a coffee at one (or more!) of the cafes, have a look at the old and historical buildings along the street, do a bit of grocery shopping and even have a picnic by the river. Purchase a copy of the Heritage Guide - Bridgetown Self Guided Walk at the Tourist Centre.

#### Memorial Park: Bridgetown

This parkland on the right hand side of the main road leading into Bridgetown from the north is perfect for a lunch stop or a friendly game of cricket or football. There are BBQ facilities, toilets, playground and big open areas to let kids run wild. A highlight of Memorial Park is the reconstruction of the wooden barque Bridgetown. In the 1860 s this clipper was the first vessel to load wool from the Bridgetown district at Bunbury and this resulted in the towns name.

#### Suttons Lookout: off Phillips Street

A panoramic, 360 degree view across Bridgetown, the Blackwood River and the Mattamatup Valley.

### Blackwood River Park: Bridgetown, just south of the town

Situated on the banks of the Blackwood River, the river park is the site of the first police station in 1862. Now a pleasant parkland with river access, walk-trails, bbq s, playground and toilets, it is ideal for a quiet sit after a day of touring or a picnic lunch. The park is transformed into a market area with local crafts, bric-a-brac, plants and clothing every second Sunday morning.

#### Walk Trails: Bridgetown and Greenbushes

Bridgetown and Greenbushes offers a variety of short and longer walks for the adventurous and the less adventurous walker! Ask the Tourist Centre about Hester Forest Walks, Greenbushes Walk Trails, Jarrah Park Walks and Geegeelup Heritage Walk.

Greenbushes offers a series of walk trails which include the **Greenbushes Loop** a 15km (5hour) walk connecting to the Bibbulmun Track at two locations, each 5km from Greenbushes.

The Mining Heritage Walk (3km/1hr) which takes the walker through old mining areas including an old mining tunnel and mine shafts from the turn of the Century and the New Zealand Gully Walk (7km/3hr) which meanders passed water holes through rehabilitated mining areas. Trails information is available from the Bridgetown-Greenbushes Tourist Centre and the Greenbushes Discovery Centre.

#### Scenic Drives

A great way to spend the day is to take a drive along one of the areas 8 scenic drives. Varying in distance from 3km to 113km, some roads are narrow and winding, some have cattle grids and some are forest roads, so take great care and keep a watch for animals and wildlife. There are ample opportunities to stop and take in the view, or have a picnic and one drive even includes our neighbouring towns Balingup and Nannup. Brochures and maps available at the Tourist Centre.
