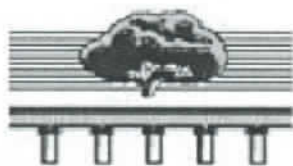
We ask you to remember that all funds raised on the day go entirely to community projects in the Bridgetown/Greenbushes and Boyup Brook districts.

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CLIVE CHOATE – 20TH BLACKWOOD MARATHON IRONMAN RACE

The Blackwood Marathon Committee extends their congratulations to Clive on his many achievements throughout this event. Clive won the first Ironman section when it was introduced into the Blackwood Marathon in 1988. Clive has been the only ironman to have participated in every marathon and has in fact, competed 10 more times on the Ironman section than any other ironman, being placed 2 times. This year will see Clive compete for the 20th consecutive year in the Ironman section.

Clive became the first person inducted into the Blackwood Marathon Relay's Hall of Fame in 1999. Not only has Clive been the most successful individual in the Relay's history but he has also written a book about experiences of his participation and freely offers advice and gives assistance to many novice competitors.

With his spirit, dedication and attitude, Clive is a great ambassador for this event. The Committee extends their thanks for the many contributions Clive has made to the Blackwood Marathon Relay. Read some of Clive's Ironman anecdotes starting on page 21.



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10. RACE RULES

The race rules form part of the entry forms and it is essential that each competitor is familiar with them. Copies of the rules are available at www.mccays.com.au/theevent and are subject to change.

SWIM START

To reduce possible extended delays to the finish of the event the starting times of swimmers may be altered. The starting order of the swimmers is generally preserved but the interval between each team may be reduced or extended. This has the result that the finishing order is not necessarily the final placing order. The timing system records start and finish times of all competitors to calculate the final positions.

Ensure that you are at the start early for your corrected start time.

Please co-operate with all marshals during the start to ensure that start times are recorded accurately.



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MESSAGE FROM THE TRAFFIC DIRECTOR

The traffic controls for the 2007 are similar to those of 2006. However it is important to note that roads are not closed. Marshals will encourage the orderly flow of traffic. Please follow their directions to ensure the smooth flow of vehicles. Emergency vehicles have right of way at all times

ROAD CLOSURE: Terry Rd will be closed between the Blackwood River Crossing where the Canoes Cross and Jayes Rd for duration of the canoeing event, approximately 10:00am to 12:00pm.

Vehicles with horses or large vehicles, coming from Boyup Brook during this time and wishing to go to the Horse start should take Boyup Brook Rd and Brown Seymour Rd to Jayes Rd.

While the closure is in effect, vehicles wishing specifically to go to the west side parking area (horse float area) from the running-canoeing changeover should proceed south on Terry Road and the bypass to Jayes Rd

cross the river by way of Jayes Bridge. Please note that there may also be delays crossing Jayes Bridge.

Outside of the closure, vehicles wishing specifically to go to the west side parking area (horse float area) from the running-canoeing changeover should proceed south on Terry Road and cross the river by way of Terry Road crossing.

Due to the risk of accidents on Jayes Bridge when there is a large number of spectators, we ask that you do not attempt to drive across the Bridge. After 1.30pm, there will be heavy east bound traffic across the bridge.

To avoid being inconvenienced by this, vehicles wishing to go from Jayes Bridge to the horse cycle changeover should park in the east side parking area. If parking in the west side parking area, leave before 12:30pm by way of Flax Road to avoid heavy on-coming traffic on Winnijup Road. If departure from the west side parking area is left later than this, it may be necessary to wait until 1:30pm when Jayes Bridge becomes available to east bound traffic.

Vehicles wishing specifically to go to the west side parking area (horse float area) at Jayes Bridge



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12. from the start at Boyup Brook Oval should go by way of Bridgetown-Boyup Brook, Brown Seymour Road and Jayes Road.

The east side parking area at Jayes Bridge will be the parking area from which all other points of interest can be universally reached. For those wishing to avert the heavier congested roads, please refer to advice in this programme given under 'Alternative Travel Routes'.

The traffic directions specifically are:-

PRE LUNCH

South bound parking and travel only for vehicles on Hack and Beatty Streets (adjacent Boyup Brook Sports Ground) from 6.30am till 9.30am.

West bound traffic only on Stanton Road from 8.30am till 10.00am.

South bound traffic only on Terry Road from junction with Stanton Road to junction with Jayes Road from 8.30am till 12.00 noon.

South bound traffic only on Terry Road-Jayes Road bypass track from 8.30am till 12.00 noon.

Jayes Bridge between the two parking area inlets will be closed to vehicular traffic when there are large numbers of spectators on the Bridge (except emergency and official vehicles).

Jayes Bridge between the two parking area inlets will be restricted when there is large numbers of spectators on the Bridge.

AFTER LUNCH

Jayes Bridge between the two parking area inlets will be impossible to cross when there are large numbers of spectators on the bridge (except emergency and official vehicles) until 1.30pm. This will ease but be dominated by east bound traffic till 3.00pm.

North bound traffic only on Terry Road – Jayes Road bypass track from 12.00 noon till 3.00pm.

West bound traffic only on Terry Road from junction with Terry Road – Jayes Road bypass track to junction with Jayes Road from 12.00 noon till 3.00pm. The intention is to have traffic move anti-clockwise out of the east side parking area to proceed via Jayes Road to the

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finish at the Bridgetown Sports Ground. Vehicles wishing to go to the cycle start should continue east along Jayes Road and follow signs to the cycle start.

West bound traffic will dominate Winnijup Road from junction with Scott-Meares Road to junction with Hester Siding Road (also Petterson Road) through to Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road from 1.15pm till 4.30pm (main section of cycle leg). Horse floats from the horse float parking area at Jayes Bridge not being able to get away by Jayes-Flax-Winnijup Road to the horse cycle changeover before 12.30pm, should wait till after 1.30pm (when Jayes Bridge becomes available to east bound traffic), then travel east across Jayes Bridge and follow signs to the cycle start, to avoid heavy oncoming traffic on Winnijup Road.

For the safety of other cyclists, support vehicles should not stop on Winnijup road to cheer on their cyclist. Vehicles should not drive immediately in front of or behind their cyclist as this will force faster cyclists to have to pass the support vehicle. Where possible, vehicles should stay on the bitumen to minimize the dust hazard.

13. Horse carrying vehicles travelling west along Winnijup Road after picking up horses at the horse-cycle changeover will be diverted into Bridgetown via Elwin Road, which is adequately sign posted, to be directed to the finish at the Sports Ground or to their camping area at the Bridgetown Show Ground.

South bound traffic only on Krsul Road from junction with Hester Siding Road to junction with Bridgetown - Boyup Brook Road from 1.15pm till 4.30pm. From this point traffic will be directed to a northern entrance to the finish at the Bridgetown Sports Ground. When leaving the Bridgetown Sports ground parking area, turn right at the back of the pavilion to proceed to the Boyup Brook Bridgetown road. Turn right into this road to travel to Bridgetown.

There will be parking marshals at the running canoe changeover, at the two parking areas at Jayes Bridge, at the parking area at the cycle start and at the finish. All parking marshals will be equipped with red jackets and flags.

Please be patient and treat other road users with courtesy. Enjoy the day.

14. **Alternative Travel Routes**

Boyup Brook to Jayes Bridge:

1. Take Boyup-Kojonup Road – turn right at Aegers Bridge Road – turn right at Jayes Road, proceed to Jayes Bridge.
2. Take Boyup-Bridgetown Road – turn left at Brown Seymour Road – turn left at Jayes Road and proceed to Jayes Bridge.

Jayes Bridge to Cycle Start:

1. From Kojonup side of Jayes Bridge – take Jayes Road towards Kojonup – turn right at Muir Road – turn right at Winnijup Road and proceed to cycle start.
2. From Bridgetown side of Jayes Bridge – take Jayes Road towards Bridgetown – turn left at Flax Road - turn left at Winnijup Road and proceed to cycle start. *Please note:- The Winnijup Road will be a one way road towards Bridgetown between 1.15pm and 4.30pm.

Jayes Bridge to Bridgetown:

1. Take Jayes Road to Bridgetown, turn left into Flax Road, turn right into Falnash Road – cross Winnijup Road into Elwin Road to Bridgetown and then to the Sports Ground.

Cycle Start to Bridgetown:

1. Turn east in Winnijup Road and cross Winnijup Bridge – turn right into Hamilton Road/Wheatley/Waters Road – continue to Bridgetown and then to the Sports Ground. NOTE: This road is winding and mostly bitumen. It is longer than the direct route, but a very nice drive and by using it, traffic congestion can be avoided.

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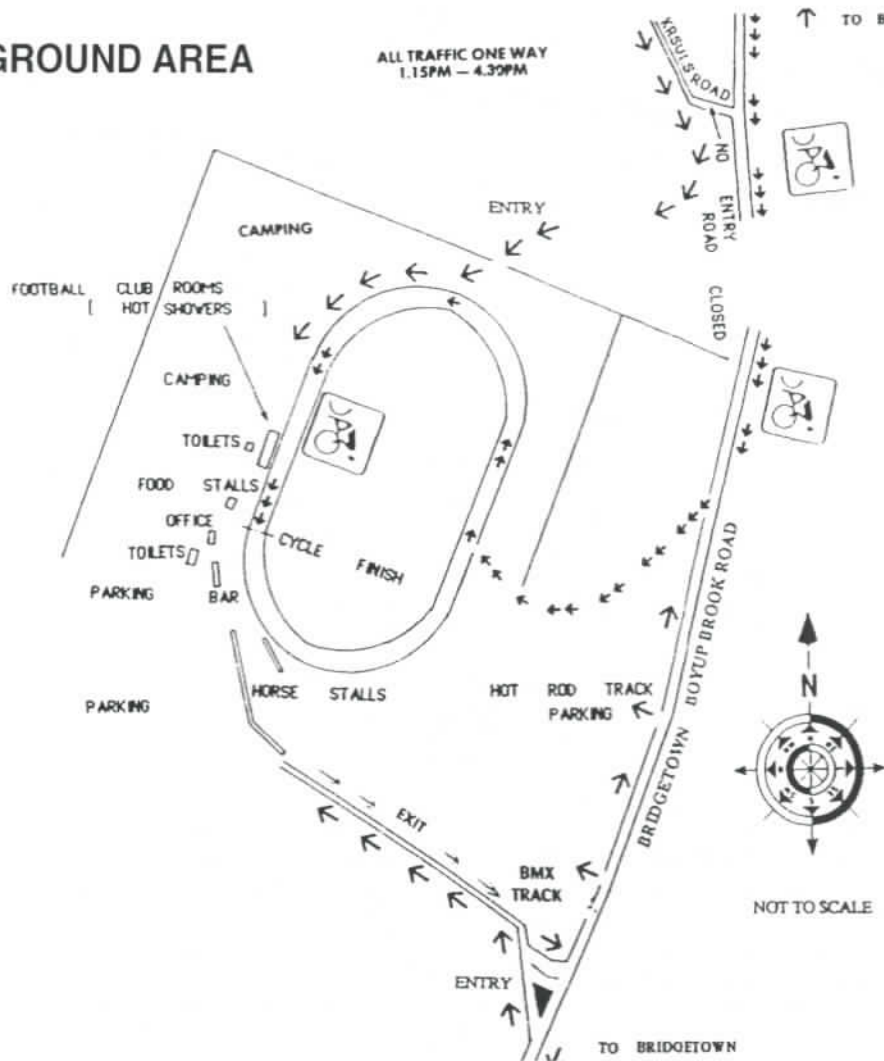

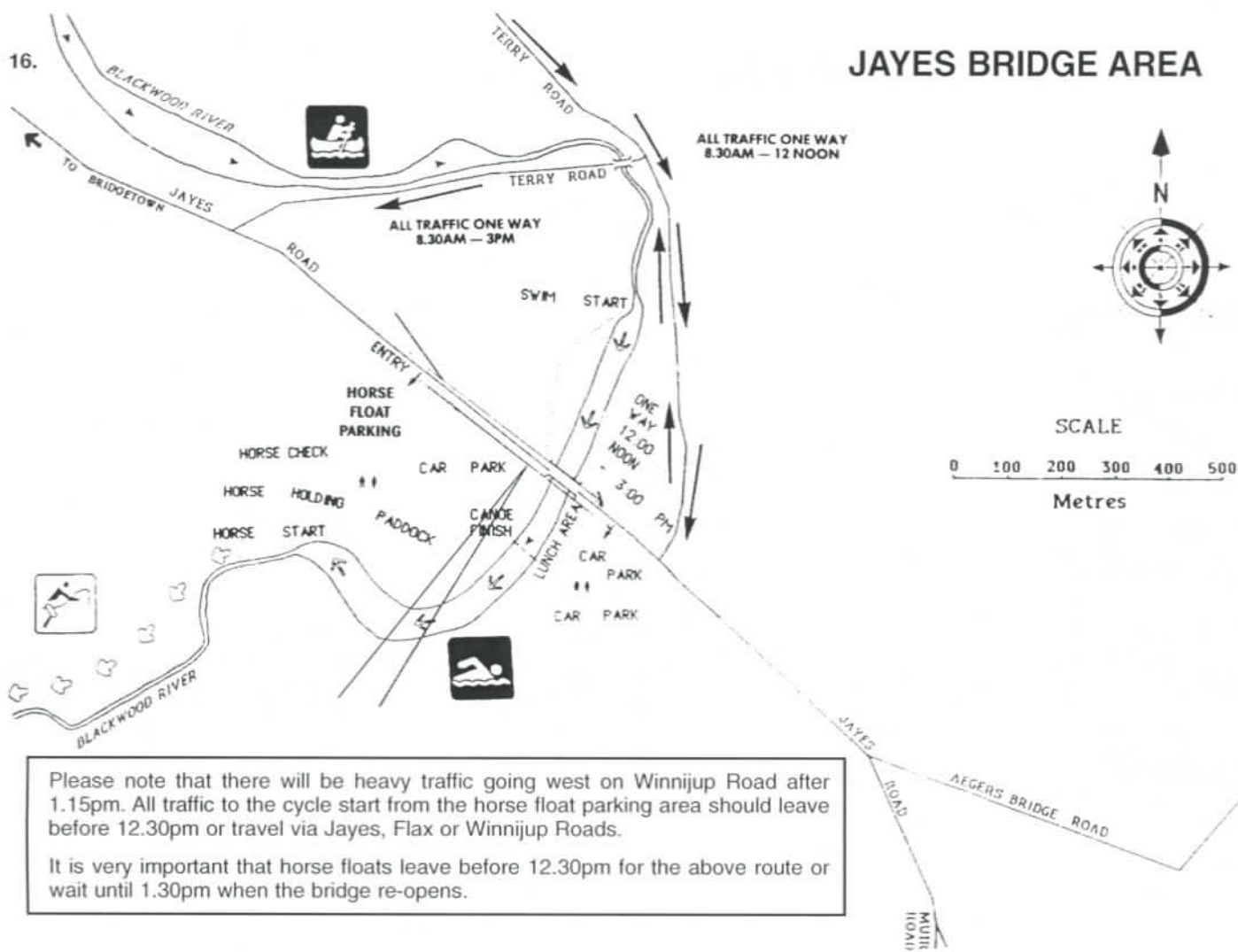

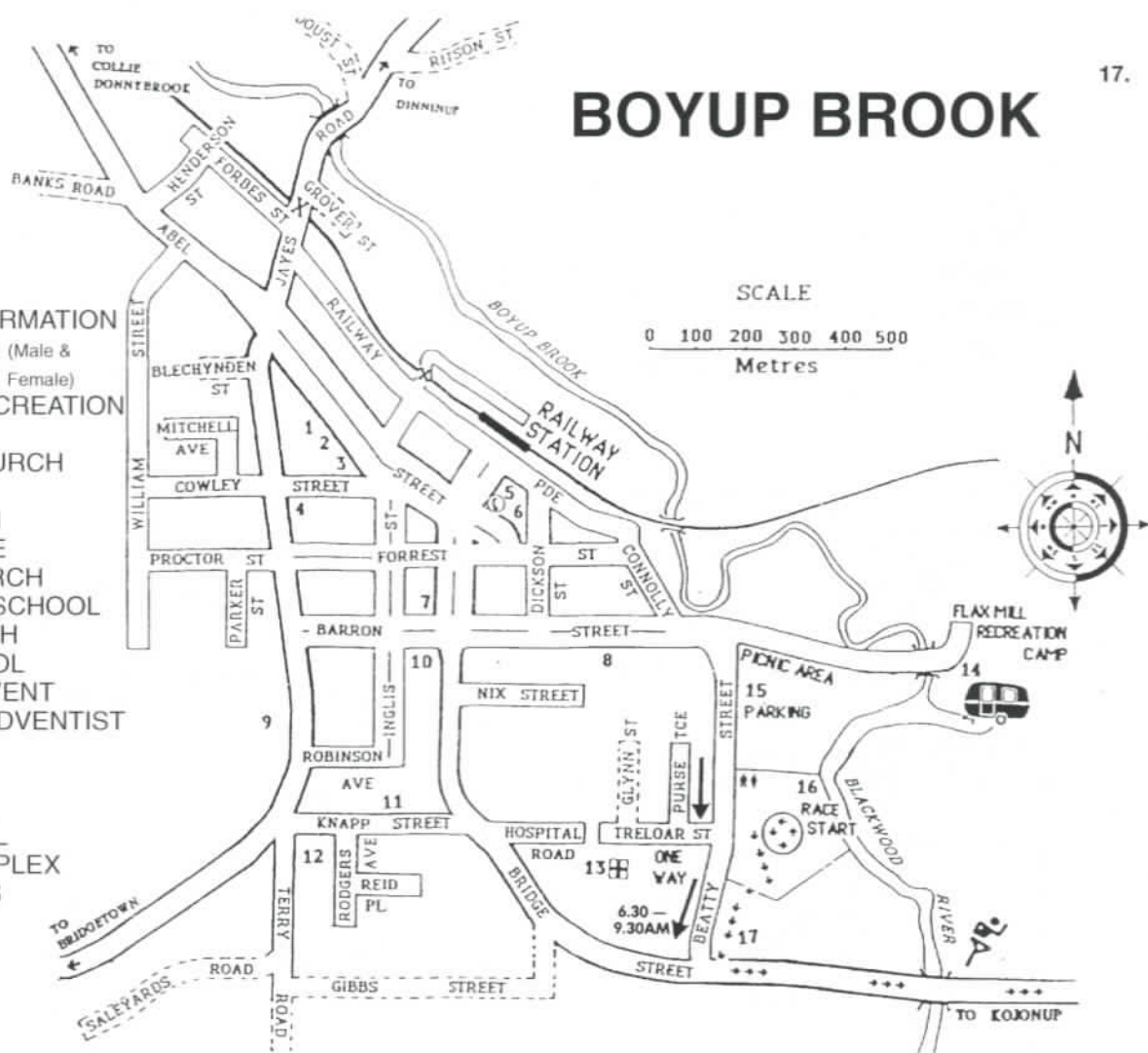

Blackwood Marathon Route

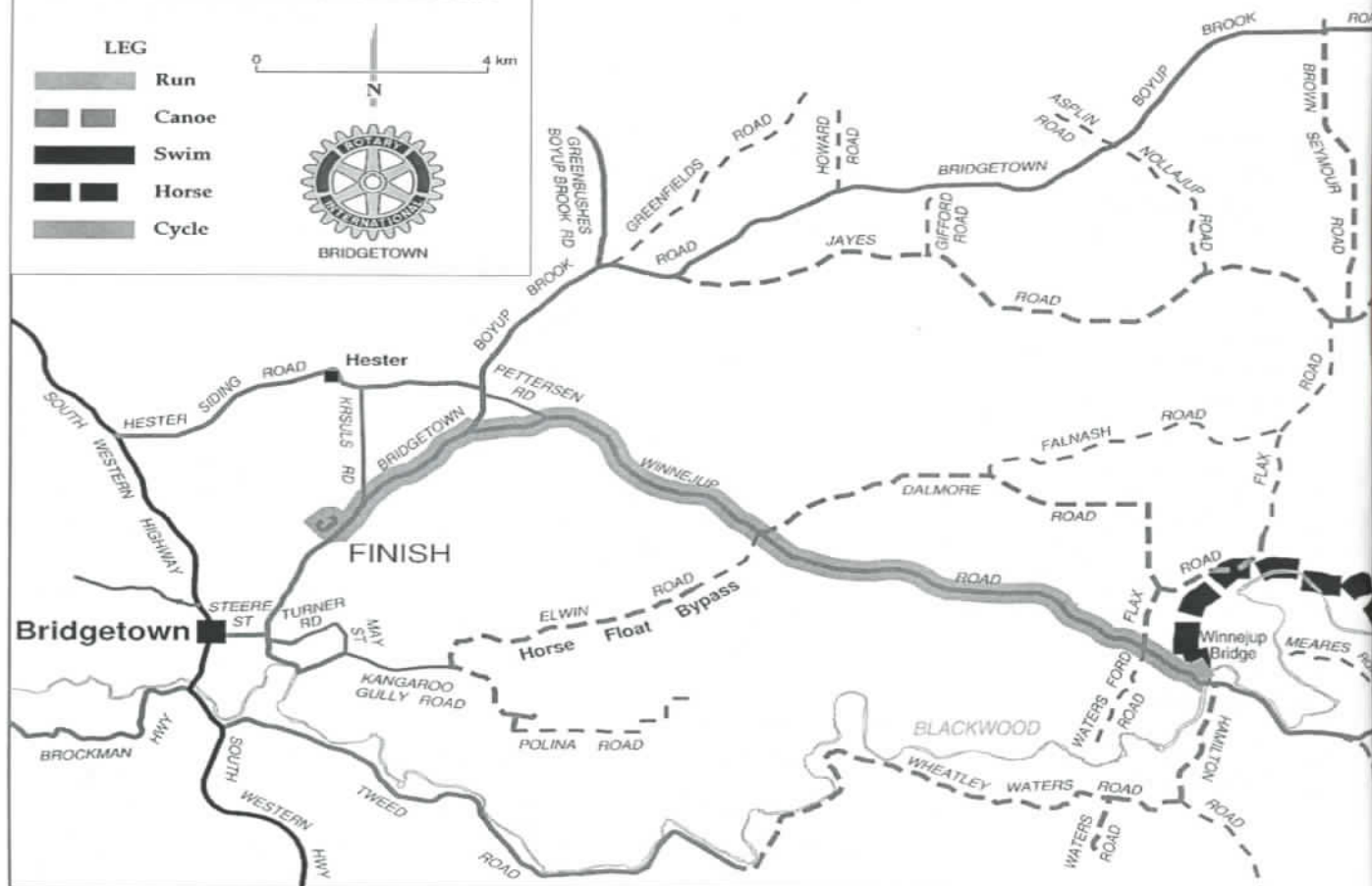

IRONMEN AND WOMEN CELEBRATE 20 YEARS – by 20 timer, Clive Choate

21.

The running of the 29th Blackwood Marathon Relay this year, sees the 20th Ironman Race.

This category was established in 1988 to celebrate Australia's Bi-Centenary, and was going to be a once off feature. However, it has created plenty of interest along the way, and become an integral part of the Blackwood.

There are many stories to be told of the 60 men and 36 women who have completed this event. It has been my good fortune to have been part of the Ironman section for all those twenty years, so I'd like to tell you about some of those personalities.

THE FIRST IRONMAN RACE - 1988

No one knew what to expect in the inaugural race. We didn't really appreciate how to handle the changeovers, we hadn't any experience in locating support crew, or how to pace ourselves, but eleven men lined up at the start.

Graham McCaulay was one of the favourites but broke a collar bone a few weeks before the start, talented Surf Club and track athlete Neil Morfitt looked a winner but struck rudder trouble, which left the inaugural event up for grabs.

I was lucky enough to take out the race by two minutes after a great contest with Greg Strelein who ran like the wind, but had a few horse problems.

EARLY DAYS

The real characters in the early days were people like Ken Eatt and Marshall Walker. They will freely admit they couldn't mix it with the placegetters, but they came back year after year, just to be part of the Ironman camaraderie.

These two did it on a tight budget. Ken would drive his small jeep which towed the float with his big black horse and Marshall's steed. Two canoes would deck the roof, two bikes on the back, and horse gear and camping equipment spilling over. They would sleep somewhere near Jayes Bridge ready for an early start.

They didn't have support crews, but solicited help along the way. Marshall would ride in at the end of the horse leg, and before setting off on the bike, plead with anyone to take his horse, and put it through the vet check.

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22. Ken was the affable guy everyone loved to see do well. He often painted his horse with big white hand prints over its rump. In the last of his nine starts whoever he'd seconded to hold his horse saw it get away before Ken came out of the river. Ken took off across the paddocks and found his horse at a farm nearby, minus one stirrup leather and a bridle. Some binding twine later, Ken set out to finish, even if it took just over 5 hours!

Greg Strelein was one of the fastest at 3 hrs 02 mins 33 secs not to have won the event. When Mandurah triathletes saw their team mate Clive win the first event, they knew they were faster, but like many entrants, they hadn't ridden horses before.

MATT RITIKIS - LOCAL BOY WINS THROUGH

Matthew Ritikis, Boyup Brook's son of farmers Alf and Polly who own the property where the canoe leg starts, learnt how to ride and took out the second event. In between travelling overseas on extended holidays, he came home and won again two years later, as a last minute entrant who managed to borrow a horse the night before the race!

Matt still races in teams, mainly canoeing, but in his four Ironman races he won twice and finished second and third. There were some really consistent competitors with Darryl Salisbury always near the leaders, Justin Hardy burning through the field on a good horse to place after four attempts, and Jeff Willoughby in his five races another keen competitor.

Stephen Brown was an outstanding canoeist and a strong cyclist. He was another to learn how to ride for this event. He won first up in a sizzling time of 3 hrs 02 mins 06 secs in 1990 which remains the fastest time for ironmen.

Stephen won three of his five starts, but it was his second race which we all remember. He was leading after the swim leg by a good eight minutes when his horse went berserk in the mounting yard. His original horse, went lame a few weeks before he race, and they took it off to the knacker to have it put down. They didn't have the heart and instead saved another horse which they used in the race.

Steve was thrown after going 50 metres and couldn't get back on. We joked later that he was "Dancing with the horse" as we galloped past. Eventually he did get back on but was thrown a few times, and ended up at a farm 5 km off the course, and in the ambulance at the finish line picking gravel out of his backside.



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KIM RANSOM - FIVE WINS

A young Bunbury bloke called Kim Ransom came on the scene in 1992 and we all took note when he finished second in his first two races. This guy was young and fit and had a wonderful support crew with his parents Joan and Ross and other family members. He was the heir apparent, and he dominated the event for the next five years when he won every race.

Kim was an exciting competitor, very quick in all legs, had great horses, and always commented, "the race really starts at the swim leg". Kim left the scene in 1999 after doing 7 races and travelled before returning to race in teams and is still good today for a story at the bar at day's end.

Numbers were light on in the late '90s. The biggest field was 16 starters in 1992 when the likes of Trevor Neaves, Paul Fyfe and Bridgetown PE teacher Gavin Milroy lined up. Paul Dallimore who still races today in teams was a star in his first attempt, crossing second only to vet out. In the late '90s only a few lined up at the start.

But it was in 1999 that this strong, athletic farming type from Narrogin, Tim Wiese took his first win after finishing second to Ransom the year before. There was a good battle between Tim and a bloke from Collie who lined up in footy shorts and Dunlop volleys, the amicable Marty Wallace.

Marty had raced into third the year before, but was determined to do well. He lead during the horse leg, but took a wrong turn near the shed about 2 km from the finish. Tim rode through thinking he was in second place and was surprised to cross the line in first.

Marty Wallace did six races finishing second four times before his big day in 2002 when he took out the event. We were all thrilled for Marty who was a fun competitor to race with.

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24. **TIM WIESE – A FEW BEERS AND SEVEN WINS LATER**

Tim Wiese began his ironman career almost by default. It was over a few beers at the finish in the days when he raced in teams, and the declaration by his wife Sarah (nee Davies) that she was going to do the Ironwoman, that got Tim into serious training. He jogged the first event in 1995, then three years later got really fit and had a good go at the contest.

It is history now that Tim Wiese has been the most successful Ironman in the history of the race. In his 10 races Tim has recorded 7 wins and one second place. No one has come near him for the last four years!

Tim is a great guy who is always keen to help newcomers and renew old acquaintances. The only threat to his dominance in the race is his wife Sarah, who is also an Ironwoman champion over this race.

2006 saw the youngest Ironman complete the course when 17 year old Dan Ramsay from Cunderdin Agricultural College crossed in just over five hours. In 1992, Michael Adams was the oldest to finish the ironman race at 58 years and 10 months.

In recent years there have only been a handful of full Ironmen who do the horse leg, with Tim dominating, but the likes of Steven Atterby on the improve. Rob Dare was with the leaders but was unlucky when his horse went lame.

Over the last couple of years many have entered the four section category. Whilst not recognised as Ironman placegetters, there was quite an resurgence last year when mainly surf club competitors swelled the numbers to 19 starters.

IRONLADIES OF THE BLACKWOOD

Sarah Wiese has been the outstanding competitor in the Ironwoman category in her eight starts. The ladies' category hasn't seen many women do more than two events, with Naomi Edmunds (5), and Rebekah Mitchell (nee Manly) (3) keen competitors.

In the early years, star canoeist and allrounder Shelley Jesney set the pace before Treana Jones had some great tussles with Jolande Joubert. Issahma Bolto, Juliet Olsen, Kerri Hill and Rowena Newcomen have all been talented competitors. Sue House had an exciting win in 1994 and with husband Geoffrey, who was always close to the men's places, became the first husband and wife competitors.

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Julia Norris (nee Bell) had some friendly rivalry with Sarah Wiese. Julia worked out that her horse was being lazy when its heart rate was lower at the finish than when she had started the leg. She completed some good races and a win in 1999, but then family duties took over.

SARAH WIESE - THE REAL CHAMPION OF THE BLACKWOOD!

Sarah Wiese though would be the most outstanding competitor of Ironmen and Ironwomen racing. In her eight starts Sarah has finished second twice, but since 1998 won easily on six occasions. Her times have come down from 3 hrs 52 minutes to the new record she set last year when she finished in 3 hrs 18 mins 14 secs.

To put that into more perspective, Sarah finished 12th in the whole field of 160 teams and individuals, an outstanding effort. She was one place behind husband Tim, who was sweating on his 4 minute lead!

What makes Sarah's wins even more remarkable is the fact that she has had three children in between these wins, and one race was even breast feeding at the lunch break. The Wiese family have been wonderful supporters of the Blackwood, and you can always see Tim's mum Chris, looking after the young kids Emma, Dan and Bill as their parents set the standard!

The Ironman race is not for everyone. Many triathletes and all round competitors might go faster over the four legs, but this category requires a lot of organisation and preparation, especially around the equestrian leg.

Individual competitors usually have a many as eight support crew to cover the different sections of the event. But the Ironman is fun. I have been privileged and lucky to have lined up for twenty consecutive races, a couple only just, due to injuries either to myself or my horse, but I've enjoyed every minute of the racing and particularly the friendships.

While I have been racing around the course over these years, spare a thought for my wife Lynne who has lugged babies, Julie, Steven and Jeffrey, horse gear, bikes and all the rest, over the last 20 years too! She is a real Ironwoman!

The Bridgetown – Boyup Brook area is choc-a-bloc full of things to do and see, take a browse through the information below and should you require any further information, call into the Visitor Centre on the main street in Bridgetown or opposite the IGA Supermarket in Boyup Brook. Art & Craft Galleries

The Blackwood River Valley has a very creative and artistic community, local art can be found all over the region. There are several small galleries lining the main street, others off the beaten track, and our local wineries also have small art exhibitions on display.

Wood and cottage craft is a vibrant and thriving industry in the area, examples of which can be found at the Visitor Centres, where they can help you arrange an appointment for viewing.

Food & Wine

The Blackwood River Valley has an outstanding collection of boutique wineries, cidery and great local produce. Think olives, cheese, organic fruit and vegetables, relish, pickles, jams & more!

Combine this with a great selection of cafés and restaurants, and your taste buds are spoilt for choice. Ask your waitress what local produce they have available, and enjoy!

Heritage Sites

Bridgedale House is the oldest remaining building in Bridgetown. It was constructed in 1862 by pioneer John Blechynden. The house was built from bricks made of clay from the riverbank and is surrounded by gardens, a great spot for a picnic.

St Pauls Anglican Church is up the main street from Bridgedale, on the corner of Phillips Street, and was built in 1911. The church contains beautiful metal works in brass, copper and silver made by the late Herbert Augustus Gordon Holdsworth (1886-1965), who lived in Bridgetown.

The Old Gaol and Police Quarters were built in 1880 by James Gibbs, Constable John Bovell was the first policeman to occupy the quarters. The original building consisted of two cells, a storeroom, kitchen, exercise yard, office, two lobbies, and two police living rooms. The gaol was used until 10th April 1970. Tours are available at the Visitor Centre.

36. Gardens & Parks

Memorial Park, referred to by locals as the 'Boat Park', is located opposite the Visitor Centre and has new playground equipment, BBQ's and a Giant Chess Board available for hire.

Blackwood River Park is situated on the southern banks of the Blackwood River, and was the site of the first police station in 1862. Now a pleasant parkland with river access, walk trails, barbeques, playground and toilets.

Winnejump Reserve is half circled by the Blackwood River and provides an important habitat for birds, reptiles, frogs and small mammals. There is a small walk and basic picnic facilities, a great spot for wildflowers – especially Kangaroo Paws.

Forest & Bush Walks

Bridgetown Jarrah Park - 20 kms west of Bridgetown on the Brockman Highway, there are two tracks. The Tree Fallers Track is 2.6 kms long and takes about an hour, The Shield Tree Track is 700 metres and takes about 20 minutes. Composting toilets are available.

River Walk - A riverside track & boardwalk that stretches for approximately 4kms. The route commences at the Blackwood River Park and follows a series of board walks over wetlands and grassy areas. There is an old path that runs alongside the river and up Grays Hill into town.

Greenbushes Walks - There are three great walks that all commence at the Discovery Centre in Greenbushes. A 15 kilometre return walk linking to the Bibbulmun Track, The New Zealand Gully Walk (7 kms, approx 2 hours return), and the Mining Heritage Walk, that winds past old mine shafts and is just 3kms long.

Greenbushes Eco Cultural Discovery Centre

Located on Blackwood Road, Greenbushes, this is a fantastic learning centre about the timber and mining industries. There are stories and photographs and a simulated mine shaft known as the "Discovery Decline." Nearby is the lookout over the open pit mining operations of Talison and a Giant Dump Truck Tyre.

The Centre is manned by volunteers and open from 1000 to 1400 Saturdays and Sundays.

Scenic Drives

A great way to spend the day is to take a drive along one of the stunning scenic drives surrounding Bridgetown, Greenbushes and beyond. There are 8 in total varying in distance from 3 – 113 kms, please see the Visitor Centre for a map and further information.
