

Race Rules

The race rules form part of the entry forms and it is essential that each competitor is familiar with them. Copies of the rules are available at www.mccays.com.au/theevent and are subject to change.

Swim Start

To reduce possible extended delays to the finish of the event the starting times of swimmers may be altered. The starting order of the swimmers is generally preserved but the interval between each team may be reduced or extended. This has the result that the finishing order is not necessarily the final placing order. The timing system records start and finish times of all competitors to calculate the final positions.

Ensure that you are at the start early for your corrected start time.

Please co-operate with all marshals during the start to ensure that start times are recorded accurately.

We endeavor to produce printed results on the day. One printout per team is provided at the Sports Ground Tote Office after the awards have been presented. Additional copies may also be available for a small fee.

Message from the Traffic Director

The traffic controls for 2010 have a number of notable changes from those of 2009. So please read the following notes carefully, so that you can be aware of the traffic flow changes on the day. It is also worth noting that there will be traffic control officers and marshals all over the course to assist traffic to move smoothly and safely around the course. Please be patient, drive safely and, most of all, enjoy your day.

KEY TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ASPECTS

Terry Road Closure

Terry Road will be closed between the Blackwood River Crossing and Jayes Road during the Canoe event between approximately 10:00 am and 12:00 noon. During this closure, vehicles with horse floats or other large vehicles wanting to get to Jayes Road and to the Horse Start are required to take the Boyup Brook-Bridgetown Road, turning into Brown Seymour Road and on to Jayes Road. During the closure, other vehicles can access the Canoe Finish/Swim Start car park east of Jayes Bridge via the Terry Road-Jayes Road bypass, starting on Terry Road near the Blackwood River crossing, via a private property track to Jayes Road, coming out just east of the Bridge. Signs and marshals will guide cars along this route. During the closure, vehicles wishing to go to the horse float area on the west side of the bridge can also take the above bypass off Terry Road to Jayes Road, but there may be delays crossing the bridge.

RESTRICTED TIMES CROSSING JAYES BRIDGE

Due to the risk of accidents on Jayes Bridge when there is a large number of spectators on the bridge between 10:30 am and 1:30 pm, we ask that vehicles do not attempt to cross the bridge. Spectators should also note that after 1:30 pm there will be heavy vehicle traffic crossing the bridge, mostly involving horse floats proceeding to the Horse Finish.

ACCESS TO HORSE FLOAT PARKING

Horse floats and vehicles wishing to get to the horse float parking area to the west side of Jayes Bridge, from the Boyup Brook Oval or other, should go by way of the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road, into Brown-Seymour Road and on to Jayes Road.

TRAFFIC ROUTES TO THE HORSE FINISH/CYCLE START

Vehicles only (not horse floats) wishing to proceed to the Horse Finish/Cycle Start from Jayes Bridge, are requested to park in the car park on the east side of Jayes Bridge. Then, leaving the car park to proceed to the Horse Finish/Cycle Start, turn right along Jayes Road, veer right into Muir Road, turn right into Winnejup Road, and carry on to the Horse Finish/Cycle Start. Horse floats and other vehicles on the west side of Jayes Bridge should take the Flax Road — Winnejup Road route from Jayes Road to get to the

Horse Finish, but must leave before 12:30 pm.

Otherwise, horse floats and other vehicles on the west side of Jayes Bridge will be asked to wait until after 1:30 pm before proceeding to the Horse Finish by travelling east across Jayes Bridge (now clear of spectators), along Jayes Road, veering right into Muir Road, turning right into Winnejup Road, and carrying on to the Horse Finish.

NOTE: As an essential safety measure for cyclists, no vehicles should use the Flax Road route after 12:30 pm to proceed to the Horse Start/Cycle Finish; thus avoiding turning left into Winnejup Road against oncoming traffic and cyclists.

RESTRICTED ACCESS BRIDGETOWN-BOYUP BROOK ROAD

As an additional safety measure for cyclists, there will be no traffic south-west (toward Bridgetown) down the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road between 1:30pm and 5:00pm.

All traffic from Winnejup Road will be diverted to Pettersen Road, onto the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road and off onto Hester Road. All traffic heading southwest toward Bridgetown on the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road will also be diverted into Hester Road. From Hester Road, traffic will either turn left into Krsuls Road to the Sportsground or will travel on along Hester Road via Hester to South West Highway, north of Bridgetown.

HORSE FLOAT ROUTE TO SPORTSGROUND

Horse Floats travelling from the Horse Finish to the Sportsground should travel there via Winnejup Road, turning left into the Horse Float bypass via Elwins Road, Kangaroo Gully Road, Turner Road and the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road.

SUPPORT VEHICLES FOR CYCLISTS

For the safety of the cyclists and other road traffic, cyclist support vehicles are not to follow slowly alongside or behind their team members during their race, and nor should support vehicles stop at any point along their route to cheer their team on. This regulation is very important to prevent congestion and other major traffic hazards for cyclists and vehicles. Please follow all road traffic rules and requirements, and drive safely.

TRAFFIC DIRECTIONS PRE LUNCH (RUN - CANOE)

South bound traffic only on Bridge/Boyup Brook-Kojonup Road between Beatty (formerly Hack) Street and Stanton Road, from 8:30 am to 10:00 am. Traffic south bound along the Bridge/Boyup Brook-Kojonup Road need to travel slowly behind the runners' escort vehicles. Traffic heading towards Boyup Brook north along the Bridge/Boyup Brook-Kojonup Road will need to divert along Stanton Road, turn right into Terry Road, turn right onto Knapp Street, entering into Boyup Brook.

12. West bound traffic only on Stanton Road, from 8:30 am to 10:30 am. South bound traffic only on Terry Road from Stanton Road to Jayes Road, from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon. South bound traffic only on the Terry Road—Jayes Road bypass track between Terry Road and Jayes Road, from 8:30 am to 12:00 noon. Terry Road closed between the Blackwood River crossing to Jayes Road, from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. Jayes Bridge will be closed to all but official vehicles when there are large numbers of spectators on the Bridge, from approximately 10:30 am to 1:30 pm.

TRAFFIC DIRECTIONS AFTER LUNCH (SWIM - EQUESTRIAN - CYCLE)

Jayes Bridge will be closed to all but official vehicles when there are large numbers of spectators on the Bridge, from approximately 10:30 am to 1:30 pm. The Flax Road from Jayes Road to Winnejup Road route should not be used for traffic proceeding to the Horse Finish/Cycle Start after 12:30 pm, as there will be no left turn into Winnejup Road due to cyclist safety requirements.

Jayes Bridge will be open to east-bound traffic from 1:30 pm providing the alternative route for vehicles, especially horse floats, to the Hose Finish/Cycle Start, via Muir and Winnejup Roads.

Horse floats leaving the Horse Finish and travelling west along Winnejup Road toward Bridgetown are, for safety reasons, asked to divert left into the Horse Float

Bypass on Elwins Road from Winnejup Road to Bridgetown, the Show Ground and the Sportsground.

Traffic travelling west along Winnejup Road to the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road will be diverted into Pettersen Road, right onto the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road, and then into Hester Road towards Bridgetown or the Sportsground.

Traffic travelling South-West down along the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road towards Bridgetown will be diverted away from the cyclist route into Hester Road towards Bridgetown or the Sportsground. At the corner of Hester and Krsuls Roads, marathon traffic can access the Sportsground by turning left into Krsuls Road, at the end of which they will be diverted via a tidy bush track into the Sportsground.

Traffic from Winnejup Road and the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road wishing to travel to Bridgetown will be directed to continue on the Hester Road, via the Hester town site and the Southwest Highway to Bridgetown. Traffic can exit the rear of the Sportsground via its main entry road, turning onto the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road, to the right to Bridgetown, and to the left to Boyup Brook.

Alternative Travel Routes

Boyup Brook to Jayes Bridge:

Take the Boyup Brook-Kojonup Road (not between 8:30 am and 10:00 am when runners are on the road) — turn right into Aegers Bridge Road — turn right at Jayes Road — proceed to Jayes Bridge. Take the Boyup Brook-Bridgetown Road — turn left at Brown Seymour Road — turn left at Jayes Road — proceed to Jayes Bridge.

Jayes Bridge to Cycle Start:

From east of Jayes Bridge — travel along Jayes Road eastwards — turn right at Muir Road — turn right at Winnejup Road — proceed to Cycle Start.

From west of Jayes Bridge — travel along Jayes Road westwards — turn left into Flax Road — turn left into Winnejup Road — proceed to Cycle Start.

Do not take this route to the Cycle Start after 12:30 pm as a left turn into Winnejup will not be permitted after 1:00 pm.

Jayes Bridge to Bridgetown:

Take Jayes Road towards the west — turn left into Flax Road — turn right into Falnash Road — veer right into Dalmore Road — cross Winnejup Road into Elwins Road — follow the signs to Bridgetown and the Sportsground. Take Jayes Road towards the west — turn left into the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road — follow the directions to Bridgetown via Hester Road during the running of the cycle leg — otherwise proceed along the Bridgetown-Boyup Brook Road into Bridgetown.

Horse Finish / Cycle Start to Bridgetown:

Turn right from Scott-Meares Road onto Winnejup Road — turn left into Elwins Road and follow the "Horse Float" signage into Bridgetown and the Sportsground. Turn left from Scott-Meares Road onto Winnejup Road — cross the Winnejup Bridge — turn right into Hamilton (Tweed) Road onto Wheatley/Waters Road and onto Tweed Road — turn right onto Southwest Highway and continue from there into Bridgetown and follow the signage up Steere Street to the Sportsground.

Please Note the following key traffic requirements:

- 1. Terry Road will be closed from the Blackwood River crossing from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon. Traffic will be diverted to Jayes Road via a bypass track across private land from the Blackwood River crossing to Jayes Road, just east of Jayes Bridge. This track is not suitable for horse floats which should travel to their Jayes Road parking along Terry Road well before 10:00 am or get there via the Boyup Brook-Bridgetown Road, Brown Seymour Road and Jayes Road.
- 2. Horse floats and traffic parked west of Jayes Bridge will not be able to access the Horse Finish/Cycle Start via Flax after 12:30 pm, and will need to wait until 1:30 pm until they can cross Jayes Bridge and proceed to the Horse Finish/Cycle Start via Muir and Winnejup Roads.

We sometimes think of committees as institutions that organise events, produce the results then move on; perhaps forgetting that committees are also a collection of individuals with other interests and other lives! This is about one of those individuals. Max has been a member of the Rotary Club of Bridgetown since 1966, following a stint as a member of Apex and has been an active member in Rotary ever since. He has been awarded Rotary's highest award — the Paul Harris Medal — and was lately fined following a heart operation for beating Bridgetown in getting a by-pass! Max has a phenomenal memory and often regales our club after dinner meetings with his tales of "old" Bridgetown. He has memorized many of Banjo Patterson's poems and delighted his family with lively recitations at his 80th birthday. And this highlights another of Max's interests — poetry. Here's one of his favourites: Optimum Result (poem of a blacksmith).

The motion study expert, looked in the smithy door and viewed with disapproval the litter on the floor.

He frowned upon the blacksmith and timed his mighty swing from the lifting of the hammer to the loud metallic ring;

He noted how his waistcoat was splitting at the seam, and many other details which showed a lack of scheme.

"My friend you have no system," he told the mighty man, To maximise your throughput you need an ordered plan.



Addendum: And if dear friend upon the absence of the pond you may wish to enquire"Down there's the flaming river" You'll be directed by the choir!



Proceeds from the Marathon

The Rotary Blackwood Marathon has been run annually for the past thirty two years, principally as a way of raising funds for the local Rotary Club of Bridgetown. During that time funds in excess of \$270,000 have been raised and have provided sustenance and support to many projects. Our Club provides on-going support to an Indonesian orphanage, and has helped establish a Technical Centre for disadvantaged people in Kenya as well as a leprosarium in India. Local Service Clubs and Community Groups are also regular direct recipients of funds raised through the Marathon. 24. Spectator Vantage Points

The course provides only limited spectator vantage points as much of the course is on open roads where traffic is restricted or through private property and other inaccessible areas. The following is a guide to some points that will provide excellent spots to view the event and or the scenery at its best in spring.

RUN

Boyup Brook Sports Ground.

Runners start at 9:00am with one lap of the oval before going out onto Boyup Brook Kojonup road.

Run end.

Off Terry Rd — plenty of spectator parking in the paddock.

CANOE

Canoe Start, off Terry Rd, plenty of spectator parking in the paddock.

See the runners hand over to the canoeists and the canoeists paddle off in the river. There is walking access to the river here.

Near the Jayes Rd /Lodge Rd intersection the river is close to the road and easily accessed.

Terry Road Crossing. A culvert takes the river under Terry Rd, the canoeists must port this crossing and re-enter the river downstream. Limited parking only on Terry Rd. Jayes Bridge is an excellent vantage point as the canoeists must travel under the Bridge to the canoe finish line 100m downstream. Plenty of parking both sides of Jayes Bridge for all spectators, competitors and their support crew. Horse float parking to the west side only.

Spectator Vantage Points – (Continued)

SWIM

The swim start is around 200m upstream from Jayes Bridge and the finish around 500m downstream. Good vantage can be had from many points on the river bank and from the bridge.

EQUESTRIAN

Equestrian start, 500m downstream from Jayes Bridge on the west side of the river.

Lodge Road, horses enter Lodge Rd 1km from the Jayes Rd intersection and continue down Lodge Rd.

Flax Rd - approx. 6kms down from Jayes Rd where the equestrian course comes up to Flax Rd for a short distance.

Equestrian end, 100m down Meares Scott Rd. Plenty of spectator parking in the paddock.


CYCLE



ART & CRAFT GALLERIES

The Blackwood River Valley has a very creative and artistic community, local art can be found all over the region. There are several small galleries lining the main street, others off the beaten track, and our local wineries also have small art exhibitions on display. Wood and cottage craft is a vibrant and thriving industry in the area, examples of which can be found at the Visitor Centres, where they can help you arrange an appointment for viewing.

FOOD & WINE

The Blackwood River Valley has an outstanding collection of boutique wineries, cidery and great local produce. Think olives, cheese, organic fruit and vegetables, relish, pickles, jams and more! Combine this with a great selection of cafés and restaurants, and your taste buds are spoilt for choice. Ask your waitress what local produce they have available, and enjoy!

HERITAGE SITES

Bridgedale House is the oldest remaining building in Bridgetown. It was constructed in 1862 by pioneer John Blechynden. The house was built from bricks made of clay from the riverbank and is surrounded by gardens, a great spot for a picnic.

St Pauls Anglican Church is up the main street from Bridgedale, on the corner of Phillips Street, and was built in 1911. The church contains beautiful metal works in brass, copper and silver made by the late Herbert Augustus Gordon Holdsworth (1886–1965), who lived in Bridgetown.

The Old Gaol and Police Quarters were built in 1880 by James Gibbs, Constable John Bovell was the first policeman to occupy the quarters. The original building consisted of two cells, a storeroom, kitchen, exercise yard, office, two lobbies, and two police living rooms. The gaol was used until 10th April 1970. Open to the public on Saturdays 10.00am to 2.00pm.

Memorial Park, is located opposite the Visitor Centre and has new playground equipment, BBQ's and a Giant Chess Board available for hire.

Blackwood River Park is situated on the southern banks of the Blackwood River, and was the site of the first police station in 1862. Now a pleasant parkland with river access, walk trails, barbeques, playground and toilets.

Winnejup Reserve is half circled by the Blackwood River and provides an important habitat for birds, reptiles, frogs and small mammals. There is a small walk and basic picnic facilities, a great spot for wildflowers — especially Kangaroo Paws.

FOREST & BUSH WALKS

Bridgetown Jarrah Park - 20 kms west of Bridgetown on the Brockman Highway, there are two tracks. The Tree Fallers Track is 2.6 kms long and takes about an hour, The Shield Tree Track is 700 metres and takes about 20 minutes. Composting toilets are available.

River Walk - A riverside track & boardwalk that stretches for approximately 4kms. The route commences at the Blackwood River Park and follows a series of board walks over wetlands and grassy areas. There is an old path that runs alongside the river and up Grays Hill into town.

Greenbushes Walks - There are three great walks that all commence at the Discovery Centre in Greenbushes. A 15 kilometre return walk linking to the Bibbulmun Track, The New Zealand Gully Walk (7 kms, approx 2 hours return), and the Mining Heritage Walk, that winds past old mine shafts and is just 3kms long.

Greenbushes Eco Cultural Discovery Centre

Located on Blackwood Road, Greenbushes, this is a fantastic learning centre about the timber and mining industries. There are stories and photographs and a simulated mine shaft known as the "Discovery Decline." Nearby is the lookout over the open pit mining operations of Talison and a Giant Dump Truck Tyre. The Centre is manned by volunteers and open from 1000 to 1400 Saturdays and Sundays.

SCENIC DRIVES

A great way to spend the day is to take a drive along one of the stunning scenic drives surrounding Bridgetown, Greenbushes and beyond. There are 8 in total varying in distance from 3 – 113 kms, please see the Visitor Centre for a map and further information.
